

Volleyball

WebQuest Description: The purpose of webquest is to help Grade 9 students to have a better understanding about the game volleyball, the rules and regulations, the violations that are usually committed and on how it is being played correctly.

Grade Level: 9-12

Curriculum: Health / PE

Keywords: volleyball, rules and regulations, violations

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Introduction

Volleyball is a team sport in which two teams of six players are separated by a net. Each team tries to score points by grounding a ball on the other team's court under organized rules. It has been a part of the official program of the Summer Olympic Games since 1964. The complete rules are extensive. But simply, play proceeds as follows: a player on one of the teams begins a 'rally' by serving the ball (tossing or releasing it and then hitting it with a hand or arm), from behind the back boundary line of the court, over the net, and into the receiving team's court. The receiving team must not let the ball be grounded within their court. The team may touch the ball up to 3 times but individual players may not touch the ball twice consecutively. Typically, the first two touches are used to set up for an attack, an attempt to direct the ball back over the net in such a way that the serving team is unable to prevent it from being grounded in their court. The game of volleyball, originally called "mintonette," was invented in 1895 by William G. Morgan after the invention of basketball only four years before.

Tasks

This is a group activity wherein you are going to share your thoughts and opinions about volleyball. After sharing, you can browse the net to supplement your answers. For this activity, the things you need to do is to answer the questions below consisting of 5 simple questions and 1 big question to be placed in a manila paper. Here are the suggested steps that will help you to accomplish your goal:
Step 1: Use the provided websites and others to answer the following simple questions:
1. What is volleyball?
2. Where was volleyball originated?
3. Who introduced volleyball?
4. What are the different equipment used in playing volleyball?
5. What are the rules and regulations in playing volleyball?
Very Important! All internet sources should be properly cited in all your work.
Step 2: Big question:
1. Why is it important to know the origin/ history of volleyball?
