Here you will travel to Asia and explore the Indian culture. You will know more about the way they live, the most representative customs of one of the oldest and unique cultures in the world and other interesting and important things. Many elements of India's diverse culture, such as Indian religions, yoga and Indian cuisine, have had a profound impact across the world. Before you begin, write a few things that are common in your country: way of life, food, customs, music, and other important issues. Throughout the activities you will identify the similarities and the differences between your culture and the most known Indian culture practices. You will also analyze how those unknown practices could differ with your way of life and thinking. So, let's start! Have fun :)

### Tasks

You will be exploring the Indian culture with your peers, in order to discover all the interesting things of this topic. Each stop you make has a link that will take you to the different activities. At the end of the activities you will be able to: Identify the differences between your own culture and the Indian culture, in order to develop a tolerant attitude towards different perspectives. Describe the common practices in Indian. Express your point of view towards Indian culture, and to take a reflective position towards yours. You should take notes, writing down the most interesting things for you, to use them later in order to develop the activities

Then, you are going to watch the video below (#1) and with the given information you have to redefine the concept you gave before. When you are done, share your ideas with your partners. 3 Watch the Prezi presentations (about Indian culture and Colombian culture) which contains interesting information about both cultures. After that you have to answer the following questions: What is the predominant religion of your country? What are the differences you found between your country's religion and the principal religion of India? Which similarities did you found about the gastronomy of these countries? What new things did you learn about Indian culture? Identify 10 facts you liked the most about Indian culture. Which behaviors or practices could get in conflict between Colombian and Indian culture? 4 Click on the links below. You will be directed to two jigsaws that are related to Indian culture. Relax for a while. When you are done, click on the videos below (Taj Mahal and the Holi festival) and answer the following questions: What do you think about the facts you saw in the video about the Taj Mahal? Do you think Colombia has a similar festival Holi? Watch the video "The color run Bogotí ½". 5 Have you ever heard about Mahatma Gandhi ? Visit the links below to get to know about these two important characters related to India. Mahatma Gandhi Then, answer: What is the most important point in his teaching ? Do you think should we apply his principles in our daily life?
