

Buying a Computer!

WebQuest Description: Students will learn the importance of computer parts and they will also learn why they are important and

their roles in the computer. Grade Level: 9-12

Curriculum: Technology Keywords: computer

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Introduction

Do you always have your face "glued" to a computer screen? Do you know what components actually make up a computer? Have you ever had any interest in building a computer? It's not as easy as everyone likes to think.

Tasks

Your assignment is to research computer components and make a presentation (as if you were building the computer) on which parts you would buy and why. Don't forget include prices, functionality, and some specifices (such as speed of device or storage space).

Process

Your presentation should be at least 30 minutes. It should include the essential parts (case, motherboard, power supply, hard drive, memory sticks, CD-ROM, and all the cables to hook them up). You are encouraged to include extra parts in your presentation such as an extra hard drive, multiple memory sticks, expansion cards, etc.
