In this Quest you are to design a presentation about your "visited" country. You need to present your country in the fun and interesting way. Make your research a creative and colorful way. You will need to use Internet, paper, scissors, glue, markers and printer to print your wonderful pictures!

By the day of presentation, you should have a written report about this country, including

Location

Geography

Government

Money

Natural resources

School

Family

Tourist Attractions

History

Food

Anything that impressed you

Also, you need to find pictures and come up with a presentation about the country (Power Point, Display, etc).

The questions to ask yourself:

Was the country as you expected it to be?

Did I find enough information to come up with a good report?

Can I give a presentation to make my audience believe that this country is the place to visit?

Have fun, learn and share what you found with us!

Process

1. First step is to locate your country on line. Use one of the regions of the world your country is located in : North America, South America, Africa, Islands and Europe, and Asia.

2. Once you have located your country's name and flag start the research. While you are in your country, look for needed information about your country. (Note: Your media center may have additional sources such as Encyclopedias and country books)

3. Your presentation should have at least 5 pictures. Each picture should be on one of the following topics: Location, Geography, Government, Currency, Natural Resources, School, Family.

4. You have to work individually, not in group.
